Good sportsmanship starts on the bench with a respectful attitude and a disciplined environment being set by the Coaches and Parents on the Team.

Let's work together to ensure that our entire league comes to know King Rebellion as not only a competitive Club, but a hockey club that plays with both class and respect. There will be zero tolerance in this organization for Players, Coaches or Parents treating others with disrespect.

Second - if our new Association is to be successful in the long term, we need to maintain a balanced approach between competitive hockey and having fun. Sure, everyone wants to win games and have competitive "A" level Rep teams, but let's not become so serious about winning games and the parental push for elite player development that we suck the fun out of the game for our players. At the end of the day, minor hockey is about fun, and kids playing with their friends. Let's play some competitive hockey, while also keeping some perspective as Parents and Coaches, that we need to let the kids be kids.

Third - even though King Township Minor Hockey runs the combined King Rep teams for NobleKing and Schomberg, we can never forget about the importance of our Local League Programs. Our Local League Teams are the grassroots of our Program, and the future Rep players at the competitive hockey level. We must continue to balance the needs of our Rep and Local League Programs, in terms of ice time needs, fundraising, and skill development. We have made some significant advances this season in terms of moving forward with a coordinated Development Program for the Local League teams, which should benefit the broader organization in future years. In addition to the Development Clinics we are offering at the Local League level, all of our Rep Teams and Rep Coaches have an important leadership role to play in making those Local League players feel like they are part of the Rebellion Club, with the Rep Teams and Rep Coaches helping to support Local League player development, provide meaningful AP and practice opportunities to help us build Local League talent, as well as help support fundraising and community social events. The Rep and Local League Programs will only "win" if we all "win" together. So please give some thought in terms of how your Rep Team can help support and develop Players, Coaches and Teams at the Local League level – who could benefit from your skill and expertise.

Finally, we need to continue to build a sense of community in our new Minor Hockey Family. This involves investing in relationship building with Team Social events, coming to each other's games to cheer on our Hometown Teams, and supporting Association Social Events & Fundraisers. Our organization will grow stronger and more successful over time as we build bridges between the villages of King Township, encouraging our Teams to interact with and support one another. We've tried hard from a scheduling perspective to schedule Hometown Game Nights throughout the week so that various Teams will be playing back to back. Come out and support our Hometown Teams and help build King Township community spirit!
